



At the heart of our vision is the desire to build bridges and build family. This resource is intended to be a tool that would help facilitate you, the spiritual leader of your family, to grow and develop your children in the fear and admonition of the Lord. While not exhaustive, our prayer is that it would give you a place to start in effort to better steward your role as mom or dad.

What follows is a four-day devotional that loosely follows our Sunday sermon series. It includes a passage to read, a prompt or two to discuss together, and a prayer to offer in response to your time. These efforts are simply offered as helpful direction. Feel the freedom to adjust, shift, or redirect the focus as best fits the few moments you take with your kids before bedtime, after dinner, or whenever you choose to lead them in God's Word.

Day 1

Passage: Read Hebrews 7:23-25

Younger Prompt: According to the passage, why were the priests many in number? Why is Jesus able to hold His priestly office forever?

Older Prompt: Why is Jesus qualified to save to the uttermost?

Pray: Lord, thank you for being our High Priest. We praise you that you alone are able to save completely and that we have confidence in you because of who you are!

Day 2

Passage: Read Hebrews 7:26-27

Younger Prompt: How does this section of scripture contrast Jesus from the high priests of the Old Testament?

Older Prompt: Why is it fitting (vs. 26) that we should have a high priest like Jesus rather than that of the Levitical line?

Pray: Lord, thank you for being not only a fitting high priest, but for also being the only one who is able to save us from our sin condition. Keep us from things that cause us to turn our hearts away from you.

Day 3

Passage: Read Hebrews 7:28

Younger Prompt: How did the law appoint men, according to this verse? How did the "Word of the oath" appoint Jesus? Consider what we've already seen in 6:13-18 for insight.

Older Prompt: What does it mean that Jesus "Has been made perfect"? Recall 2:10 and the use of "perfect" OR "complete".

Pray: Lord, thank you for fulfilling the Law through Jesus your son. Thank you for attaining, on our behalf, what the law and former priesthood could not.

Day 4

Passage: Hebrews 8:1-2

Younger Prompt: What does this passage say is the author's point?

Older Prompt: What is the significance of the point the author is making? Why does it matter?

Pray: Lord, thank you for being our high priest. Help us to remember you and all you've done for us, that we might walk in joy and confidence, no matter our circumstance.
