



At the heart of our vision is the desire to build bridges and build family. This resource is intended to be a tool that would help facilitate you, the spiritual leader of your family, to grow and develop your children in the fear and admonition of the Lord. While not exhaustive, our prayer is that it would give you a place to start in effort to better steward your role as mom or dad.

What follows is a four-day devotional that loosely follows our Sunday sermon series. It includes a passage to read, a prompt or two to discuss together, and a prayer to offer in response to your time. These efforts are simply offered as helpful direction. Feel the freedom to adjust, shift, or redirect the focus as best fits the few moments you take with your kids before bedtime, after dinner, or whenever you choose to lead them in God's Word.

Day 1

Passage: Read Hebrews 9:1-5

Younger Prompt: What does the author of Hebrews describe in these verses? What was the "tent" he mentions here?

Older Prompt: What was the significance of the tent (or tabernacle)? Why was it constructed to such particular specifications? (See Exodus 25-31 for review).

Pray: Lord, thank you for being a God of design. Thank you for making all things specific, in order that they might point to you. Help us to seek you and you alone.

Day 2

Passage: Read Hebrews 9:6-10

Younger Prompt: Who is the only one able to enter into the Holy of Holies? How often did he go? What was he required to take with him?

Older Prompt: How was the Old Covenant process an "indicator" of the way to the holy place through Jesus (vs. 8)? How was this arrangement symbolic?

Pray: Thank you for your plan of redemption from the very beginning. Thank you that because of Jesus we have a path to your Presence.

Day 3

Passage: Read Hebrews 9:11-12

Younger Prompt: How did Christ appear, according to vs. 11? Where did He enter and by what means? What did this ultimately achieve?

Older Prompt: How is Jesus, our High Priest, like the high priest of the Old Covenant? How did each one provide entrance into the Holy Place, and which is better?

Pray: Lord, thank you for being our High Priest and for securing an eternal redemption on our behalf.

Day 4

Passage: Hebrews 9:13-14

Younger Prompt: What did the blood of goats and bulls do in the Old Covenant? What does the blood of Christ do in the New Covenant? Which is better and why?

Older Prompt: What does it mean that our consciences are purified from dead works to now serve the living God?

Pray: Lord, thank you for making us clean. Thank you for calling us into your service. Show us where you want us to go and give us the faith we need to obey your voice.
